

The Tell My Story event is unlike any mental health event in the country.

Jason talks to you from the real perspective of loss, self-analysis, and redemption as he tries to help others avoid what happened to him.

In the year following his son's death, Jason has done a TEDx Talk, Goalcast, and ThriveUnion talk where he openly talks about the loss of his son and the signs that he wishes he saw.

His documentary film, Tell My Story, follows Jason's journey to discover what exactly happened to his son and what is happening to kids all around the world.

On his website chooselife.org, Jason has outlined a plan to end teen suicide by 2030 and is dedicating the next ten years of his life to achieving this goal.
